THE OFFICIAL VESTMENTS

BETHEL GOSPEL TABERNACLE FELLOWSHIP INTERNATIONAL

As a policy for Bethel Gospel Tabernacle Fellowship International, it is our custom that all pastors, ministers and deacons, be fully vested during special ordination, licensing and elevation sacred services or when the International Bishop, Chief Prelate, Dr. Roderick R. Caesar, advises otherwise.

AN UNDERSTANDING OF THE VESTMENTS

The word *vestment* is from the Latin, and signifies *simply clothing*, but it is now used generally to denote the garments worn by the ministers of religion in the performance of their sacred duties. They are the uniform of the minister when he is "on duty," while he is exercising the functions of his ministry and using the sacred blessings which he received at his ordination. Vestments are not like costumes in a theatre, but rather are worn in worship when we come together in the presence of the living God. Vestments are worn when fulfilling an official function or office.

WHY WEAR VESTMENTS?

Like other elements in the church, such as the altar, stained glass windows, the cross, musical instruments and so on, vestments add a rich and colorful element to the celebration of a sacred service. A vestment can help cover over the identity of the persons wearing them. We cannot, for example, tell whether a person is rich or poor by the clothes they wear hidden under their vestments. In this way a person's wealth, status and personal idiosyncrasies can disappear behind the Lord they serve. In worship our Lord must increase, we must decrease (*John 3:30*).

ORIGINS

Many of the Church's vestments have their origin in the everyday wear of the Roman Empire. The clergy maintained the simple clothes it had always worn. Over time their clothes were so out of date that they did not resemble everyday wear at all and they became the distinctive mark of the clergy. Many of the vestment's symbolic meanings evolved later.

In the Middle Ages, two popular interpretations of the meaning of the vestments arose. The most prevalent one interpreted the vestments as symbols of Jesus' passion: the cincture, the ropes and fetters which bound Him during the scourging. The other popular interpretation focused on the vestments in their symbols of the minister as the soldier of Christ doing battle against sin and Satan.

The Cassock, or soutane, is an item of Christian clerical clothing used by the clergy of Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Anglican and Reformed churches, among others. "Ankle-length garment" is the literal meaning of the corresponding Latin term, *vestis talaris*. The single-breasted cassock worn by Anglicans has thirty-nine buttons rather than the Roman complement of thirty-three, some-

times light-heartedly suggested as signifying the 39 stripes Jesus bore for us. Spiritually, the cassock reminds the minister of the charity of Christ: "Over all these virtues put on love, which binds the rest together and makes them perfect" (Colossians, 3:14).

The Cincture is the proper name for the girdle worn around the waist to bind the cassock closely to the body. (Exod. 29:9 - ...and you shall gird [Aaron and his sons] with sashes and tie headdresses on them; and the priesthood shall be theirs by a perpetual ordinance.) The two ends that hang down by the side have silk fringes,. It symbolizes having truth encircling your inward being (Eph 6:14).

The Deacon's Stole, traditionally, was crisscrossed on the chest of the deacon to symbolize the cross. It is worn across the sides with a closure in place signifying the piercing of our Lord. The stole reminds the deacon not only of his authority and dignity as a deacon but also of his duty to preach the Word of God with courage and conviction (*Hebrews 4:12*) and to serve the needs of the faithful, the needy and the less fortunate.

The plain Clerical Shirt/blouse worn today by the clergy is a remnant of the longer cassock.

The Clerical Collar worn by clergy evolved in the seventeenth century. The modern clerical collar of today comes from the starched collars of the nineteenth century and symbolizes being yolked to Christ.

Liturgy: The word liturgy comes from a Greek term meaning "public work" or "work done on behalf of the people." Liturgy always referred to an organized community. A work, then, done by an individual or a group was a liturgy on behalf of the larger community. All the worshipers are expected to participate actively in each liturgy, for this is holy work, not entertainment or a spectator event. Every liturgical celebration is an action of Christ the High Priest and of His Mystical Body, which is the Church. It therefore requires the participation of the people of God in the work of God.

Liturgy is centered on the Holy Trinity. At every liturgy the action of worship is directed to God the Father, from whom all blessings come, through the Son in the unity of the Holy Spirit. We praise the Father who first called us to be His people by sending us His Son as our Redeemer and giving us the Holy Spirit so that we can continue to gather, to remember what God has done for us, and to share in the blessings of salvation.
